
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Get involved in the unique boxing-based fitness scheme





What is OzBox?

The OzBox scheme involves sessions of non-contact boxing and fitness training.

The sessions are about having fun but they also teach young people to take pride in themselves and in their community.

It was set up in Chesterfield in 2003 by Steve Osbaldeston MBE, a police officer, to encourage young people to keep fit and lead healthy lifestyles to help stop them getting involved in anti-social behaviour and crime.

Such was the demand and success of the scheme, OzBox sessions are now held across the county.

OzBox is delivered by more than 300 trained volunteers including police officers, PCSOs, youth workers, students, firefighters and members of the community.

All the equipment is provided and the sessions are FREE for all young people, aged 11 to 19 years old.

It is recognised and supported by the Amateur Boxing Association of England (ABAE). Country Crop, a local business, donates fruit which is available at the sessions.

The success of the OzBox scheme has been nationally recognised. OzBox was voted as the winner of the Daily Mirror People's Award at the 2009 Justice Awards.



Who benefits from OzBox?

OzBox is a unique and innovative activity. As well as benefiting local communities by offering a challenging and energetic pastime for young people, those attending OzBox sessions benefit from skilled training, with a chance of progression for those who demonstrate an aptitude for the sport. Ricky Pearce was introduced to boxing through OzBox. He has since gone on to achieve national honours for professional boxing.

What is the future for OzBox?

OzBox is growing and developing. It has received funding from Derbyshire County Council and the Big Lottery Reaching Communities Fund to expand the scheme even further across the county.

The funding will enable more sessions to be run in schools and through mobile and community gyms.

It will also help to recruit hundreds more OzBox coaches to deliver sessions and encourage them to become qualified sports leaders and mentors to young people at risk.
